### STUDENT CHARTER

#### Preamble

- 1. The College provides educational, academic, welfare and career support to aid and encourage all students to build on their strengths in advanced study; develop their appetite for intellectual and personal growth; and benefit fully from College life.
- 2. To achieve this, the College aims to offer access to high-quality support, at the point closest to an individual student's needs, by different teams in a way that takes account of each student's individual circumstances.
- 3. To promote this, the College asks each student to actively engage in and shape their education; and to seek solutions and advice when their academic progress or any other part of College life causes concern to them, other students or the staff who teach them.
- 4. To further this, the College aims in this charter to give all members of the academic community a clear understanding of the roles and responsibilities that they, the College, and the Students' Union have in meeting the above expectations.

# Student responsibilities

- 5. All students have a responsibility to:
  - (a) make the most of their programme, their College experience and the other opportunities that the College and the Students' Union have to offer;
  - (b) treat all members of the College community with respect;
  - (c) represent the College as responsible ambassadors through their good conduct on and off campus and ensure their actions have a positive impact on the College and the local and wider community;
  - (d) participate in the College's culture of learning, which is based on celebrating strengths and diversity, critical enguiry, debate and self-motivation;
  - (e) pursue their academic and professional studies in a diligent, honest and responsible manner;
  - (f) engage with the College in forming their own education and career goals, and monitor their progress towards these goals;
  - (g) engage with College initiatives to promote environmental and community sustainability; and
  - (h) comply with the College's policies, regulations, and procedures.

### College responsibilities

- 6. The College has a responsibility to ensure that all students can:
  - (a) learn within a framework that facilitates their active learning and helps them achieve the outcomes of their programme;
  - (b) make use of appropriate learning resources and support so that they can take responsibility for their own learning and improve their knowledge, understanding, career development, skills and competencies;

- access a tutor/supervisor or programme leader, who will provide regular opportunities to discuss academic assessment, progress and personal development;
- (d) receive effective and timely feedback on their academic work;
- (e) enjoy a safe place on campus in which to work and study and which considers the effect of its activities on the environment and the local community;
- (f) access professional welfare services designed to support all students;
- (g) get clear information on College fees and have access to advice and guidance about student loans, hardship funds (where available) and other student funding;
- (h) express and debate their views freely within the law;
- (i) participate in the Student Representation System; and
- (j) get information on professional and regulatory requirements relevant to their programme.

## Students' Union responsibilities

- 7. As a student-led organisation, GSM London Students' Union has a responsibility to:
  - (a) be the recognised voice of the student body, and campaign on its behalf;
  - (b) provide a safe and enjoyable space for members and offer opportunities for getting involved in societies, student groups, volunteering and safe employment to promote personal development;
  - (c) welcome new and returning students to the College and support them in their transition to and from College;
  - (d) promote the importance of personal safety and wellbeing;
  - (e) strive to improve the quality of life of students and their integration with the local community;
  - (f) give access to, or signpost, free advice on academic, finance, housing, immigration and employment issues;
  - (g) offer support to students in formal College procedures;
  - (h) hold free and fair elections within a democratic structure; and
  - (i) use resources responsibly in the interests of students and re-invest student spending back into Union services.
